Score	Requirement
6	<p>Accurately identifies two or more different claims from the reading selection and explains the relationship of these claims to figure 1 and 2 with a high degree of accuracy, complexity and/or insight. <b><u>In addition</u></b>: accurately identifies additional claim(s) and their relationship to one or both of the figures; discusses the relationship between the figures and the reading using perceptive analysis; or: explains an additional aspect of a figure's relationship to the reading <b><u>with accurate and precise use of numbers</u></b>.</p> <p>C1 + F1 C2 + F2 C3 + F1 (or F2) C4 + F1 (or F2)</p>
5	<p>Accurately identifies two different claims from the reading selection and explains the relationship of these claims to figure 1 and figure 2 with precision and complexity. In addition, explains the relationship of one additional claim either figure 1 or figure 2, <b>or</b>: explains an additional aspect of either of a figure to one of the claims already stated <b><u>with accurate and precise use of numbers</u></b>.</p> <p>C1 + F1 C2 + F2 C3 + F1 (or F2)</p>
4	<p>Accurately identifies two different claims from the reading selection and explains the relationship of these claims to figure 1 and figure 2 <b><u>with accurate and precise use of numbers</u></b>.</p> <p>C1 + F1 C2 + F2</p>

Score	Requirement
3	<p>Accurately identifies two different claims from the reading selection and adequately explains the relationship of one claim to either figure 1 or figure 2, but the connection between the other claim and a second figure is either missing, inadequate, or inaccurate.</p> <p>C1 + F1 (or F2) C2</p>
2	<p>Accurately identifies one claim from the reading selection and adequately establishes a relationship between that claim and one or both figures.</p> <p>C1 + F1 (or F2)</p>
1	<p>Makes an attempt, but does not accurately identify any claims from the reading selection, <u>or</u>, identifies multiple claims without connecting them to either of the figures, <u>or</u>, talks about one or both figures without linking them to any of the claims in the reading selection.</p> <p>C but no F F but no C</p>
0	<p>Blank, completely off-topic, illegible, or written in a foreign language.</p>
