The mission of the USDOT is to ensure that all ground, air, and water transport remain fast, safe, efficient, accessible and convenient. The DOT buys more than \$4 billion annually in products and services. DOT consists of 11 organizations with their own contracting authority: the Office of the Secretary and 10 Operating Administrations. The DOT provides information on potential opportunities for each of the Operating Administrations, with the exception of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) which issues its own forecast. The Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) is a network of transportation agencies that move millions of commuters daily in and around New York City. The agencies are NYC Transit which manages the NYC subway and bus systems, the Long Island Railroad, the Long Island bus company, Metro-North Railroad, Bridges and Tunnels which operates 7 city bridges and 2 tunnels connecting the 5 boroughs, and the newer Bus Company which operates 7 bus companies previously operating under franchises. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority was established in 1949 to operate New Jersey's two most densely traveled roadways: The NJ Turnpike and the Garden State Parkway. Running through one of the nation's busiest regions, from New Jersey's northern meadowlands to its southern farmlands, the Turnpike is the road to the region's growth. The 173-mile Garden State Parkway runs north and south, through 50 municipalities in 10 counties, from the New York line at Montvale to the Cape May Ferry in Cape May.
