

## TELC Level 7.1 L/S Digital Storytelling Assignment

Final Due date: May 23 (Script due May 9)  
Length: 1-3 minutes  
Format: Windows Media Video

In this project, you will be using digital media to tell a story from history. The idea is to research the event and to tell the story from the perspective(s) of someone who lived through it.

You will work in a group of three. Every member of the group must participate in the research, writing of the script, collection of images, and narration.

Part I: Finding Your Place in History (Week 1 - April 11 and 18)

We are going to begin to discuss ideas in class. Each group will come up with a historical event that they would like to tell using audio and images. ***YOUR PROPOSAL IS DUE ON APRIL 18.***

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Part II: Writing and Refining (Week 2 - 3, April 25 and 27, and May 2)

Groups will work in class and at home to write a script for their story. Through peer editing and help from Liz, you will refine your script. ***FIRST DRAFT WILL BE DUE ON May 2. FINAL SCRIPT WILL BE DUE ON May 9.***

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Part III: Practicing pronunciation (Week 3 - 4, May 9 and 11)

Getting your story across clearly is key to engaging listeners. We will *practice, practice, practice* the script, making very specific corrections to pronunciation. I will work with each of you in the class and the computer lab.

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Part IV: Adding Digital Media (Weeks 5 - 6, May 16, 18, and 23)

We will create PowerPoint files with photos and images. These can be personal photos, images created on the computer, or images from the Internet. We will then export the PowerPoint slides as images to Windows Movie maker, add your speech to the file, and add music if you choose to.

Don't worry about the digital stuff. I will take everyone through it step by step and give you plenty of help. We will do all of the digital work in the computer lab. All you need is your imagination!
