

Articulation Agreement with Queens College, City University of New York Associate in Arts (AA) Degree in Childhood Education

This articulation agreements positions students for entrance into the Queens College Elementary Education NYS Initial Certification Program-Professional Sequence¹.

Admission requirements for senior college program (e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

As per Queens College's Guidelines:

To be accepted into the elementary education program, a student must have met the following requirements:

- 1. A grade of B is required in one course in each of the NYS Core Areas (English, Social Science, Math, and Physical Science); no grade lower than a C is acceptable in the program. The transferibility of grades lower than C is determined by the senior college.
- 2. Grade of B or better required in ENG101 or ENG102.
- 3. If students do not take courses recommended in the Flexible Core at LaGuardia they may have to take additional courses to complete their degree requirements at Queens College.
- 4. Grade of B or better required in ELN 120, SSY105, ELE110, and ELE 203.
- 5. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 is required to graduate from the program.
- 6. 15 fieldwork hours from ELN 120, 15 fieldwork hours from ELE 203, 15 fieldwork hours from ELE 110, and 25 fieldwork hours from SSY 105 for a total of 70 hours applied to 100 hours of experience with children.
- 7. All students must successfully complete two (2) writing-intensive classes (designated "WI") to fulfill degree requirements.

¹ Since the education curricula at Queens College are periodically reviewed and updated in order to remain compliant with the standards and requirements set forth by entities such as the New York State Education Department, various accreditation agencies, academic departments, etc., the terms described in this document--such as the GPA requirement--are subject to change. As such, while every effort will be made to widely publicize any changes, students are urged to consult with an appropriate advisor for any amendments.

Liberal Arts and Sciences Requirements

All students at Queens College are required to satisfy the College's liberal arts and sciences requirements. Students who are interested in obtaining New York State (NYS) Initial Certification in Childhood Education 1-6 must select liberal arts courses that correspond to the NYS learning standards for elementary school teachers. Students must complete specified liberal arts coursework and meet minimum grade requirements in core areas in order to be considered for admission into the education professional sequence. Students should work closely with an advisor in selecting their courses to fulfill their requirements for General Education, EECE, and NYS initial certification.

Please note these liberal arts courses may not be taken with the P/NC option; no grade lower than "C" will be accepted. Each of the core courses may only fulfill one core requirement and must carry at least three credits. Core courses with "W" designation may be used to fulfill writing-intensive units.

Application to the Professional Sequence of EECE program

Students must formally apply to the EECE program in order to begin in the EECE professional sequence.

Liberal Arts and Science Co-Major

Students are required to complete a co-major in a liberal arts and science department or program of no fewer than thirty (30) credits. Majors such as accounting, business administration, fashion merchandising or design, or any other teacher education certification program are not acceptable as co-majors.

For Initial NYC Certification Childhood Education (Grades 1-6) students must:

- Complete the courses, practicum, and portfolio requirements of the Childhood Ed 1-6 Initial Certification Program
- Complete a co-major in an approved liberal arts and science area
- Satisfy all Queens College graduation requirements
- Complete state-approved seminars of child abuse, maltreatment, and abduction; substance abuse; school violence; safety education, and the Dignity for All Students seminar.
- Pass the NYS Certification Exams: Liberal Arts and Science Test (LAST), the Elementary version
 of the Assessment of Teaching Skills (ATSW) and the Content Specialty Test (CST), and EdTPA

Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

- This agreement is effective for three academic years from the date of implementation (Effective Date below). Unless it is renewed in the third year, the agreement will expire.
- When any of the programs within this agreement undergo any changes relevant to this agreement, the agreement will be reviewed and revised as necessary by the Curriculum Committees of both the sending and receiving program. Minimally, the agreement will be reviewed at least once a year with particular attention directed to any curricular changes at the sending and/or receiving departments.

Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

• Both the Advising Offices and the Institutional Effectiveness Offices from each campus will keep data on the academic progress of the transfer student

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

- Notices of Articulation will be placed in respective catalogues, recruiting brochures, and websites
- Respective Transfer and Academic Advisors will be informed about and provided copies of this agreement
- Members of the Senior College Enrollment Management Division will have this agreement and attend recruitment events at the Sending Institution.

Additional information regarding General Education:

- This agreement is deemed to be consistent with the CUNY Pathways General Education curriculum, and will be updated whenever necessary in keeping with changes in the Pathways curriculum
- General Education at Queens College requires up to a total of twelve (12) credits of additional Pathways classes as part of the College Option. (This number is reduced to six (6) credits for students who have completed their Associate's Degree.)
- In addition, all students must take three (3) Writing Intensive (W) classes. (This number is reduced to two (2) classes for students who have completed their Associate's Degree.) A number of Pathway's classes at Queens College are also W classes, and most majors include one or more W classes, so the writing requirement need not add additional general education credits.
- Finally, there is a residency requirement: Students must complete at least 45 credits on Queens College campus to earn a Queens College degree.
